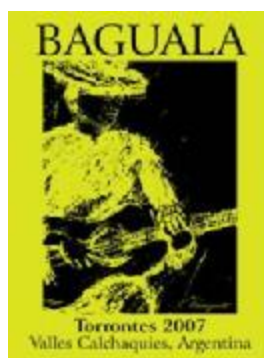
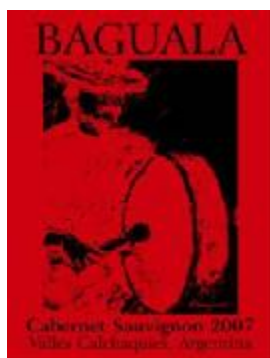
## Valles Calchaquíes, Argentina

### *Baguala, the music of the Argentine mountain people*

The Calchaquí Valley in Northwest Argentina is characterized by fertile soil, a dry climate, warm days and cool evenings. The vineyards are among the highest in the world and are irrigated in part by the snowmelt from the high mountains to the west. It is here that Finca La Buena creates the Baguala wines. With over 500 acres of 8-year old vines, owner Lee Blaugrund and oenologist/vineyard manager Sebastian Saravia are growing grape varietals such as Malbec, Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and Tannat.

The first bottling of Baguala wines took place in 2007. The Cabernet Sauvignon, Torrontés, and Corte Tinto (a blend of Cabernet, Syrah, Malbec and Merlot) will be available soon. 24,000 cases were produced in 2007; 38,000 are forecasted for 2008.

### *Winemaker's tasting notes*

2007 Cabernet Sauvignon: Ruby red color with notes of green pepper on the nose as is typical of this varietal in the Calchaquí Valley. Well-balanced and easy going.

2007 Corte Tinto: Intense color with violet overtones. An easy drinking wine with aromas of fresh fruit and hints of plum

2007 Torrontés: Elegant. Beautiful citrus aroma with a fresh, full-bodied finish. The region's signature varietal.
